MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU

Memorandum of Understanding

THIS AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as "MoU") is entered into on (date to be decided mutully) day of July, 2019 by and between

Department of Higher Education (hereinafter referred to as "HED") and address at Mini Block Civil Secretariat, Jammu, J&K and Civil Secretariat, Srinagar, J&K, Jammu and Kashmir 191101 and

Central University of Jammu (hereinafter referred to as "CUJ") situated at Bagla (Rahya Suchani), Samba, Jammu and Kashmir 181143, India

HED and CUJ are also referred to herein individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

PURPOSE OF THE MOU

The purpose of this MoU is to build the collaboration and strengthen the understanding between the above two organizations and conduct collaborative Skill Development Activities in Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir consistent with national agenda. Both the parties are committed to provide need based, quality technical and professional human resources to the industry, business and community with a mutual co-operation.

SCOPE

The scope of this MOU is to define the areas of work where both the parties desire to cooperate to benefit from each other's strengths and expertise. The parties agree that Central University of Jammu shall also be one of the academic partners in skilling initiatives of HEIs under HED. CUJ shall endeavour for smooth implementation and monitoring of the same.

Proposed areas of collaboration are:

- Vocational Training
- Incubation in the areas of technology and social ventures.
- Mutual Co-operation and assistance for organizing Events like Conferences, Seminars, and Exhibitions & Workshops etc.
- Lateral Entry of Vocational Learners as per NSQF Guidelines in various programs
 offered by School of Business Studies and Community College, Central University of
 Jammu. Some of the disciplines in which collaborative activities can be conducted
 immediately are as under:

- Digital Marketing

- Soft Skills and Personality Development
- Entrepreneurship and Small Business Management

- Beauty and Wellness-(Skin Care Services)
- Tourism Management
- Yoga and Naturopathy

The above list can be expanded to include other disciplines after discussing the modalities by both the parties.

1. Obligations of both the parties:

- Both parties to identify the areas of collaboration, conceptualize the project proposal(s) and jointly organize Awareness Programme(s)/ Events/ R&D projects / Product development/Skilling Initiatives/ other services etc.
- To execute Events / R&D Projects funded by the Government and/or Industries on mutually agreed terms and conditions (on case to case basis) between CUJ and HEIs, under HE D
- 2nd Party will provide consultancy to Department of Higher Education, J&K on mutually agreed terms and conditions
- 2nd Party shall be responsible for conduct of skill courses/Certification and placement whereas the Department of Higher Education, Jammu and Kashmir (1st Party) will provide necessary infrastructure and budgetary support to the HEI for implementation of Skill Based Schemes and programs, they choose to offer to their students from the basket available with CUJ.
- 2nd Party will be responsible for conduct of Career Counselling Sessions/Soft Skill Workshops/Training of Trainers (ToT)/ Hands on training sessions on ICT/Technical/Professional Skills for trainees of identified courses
- CUJ will act as academic partner for Skilling Initiatives of HED, they choose from the courses on offer from CUJ Skill basket
- Students of HEIs will opt for skill based programmes from the identified list of courses/sectors/Job Roles
- With mutual understanding between HED and CUJ Skill Based Program having employability potential will be introduced in select HEIs.

- The detailed list of sectors and job roles will be mutually decided by the parties before the execution of the programme as per expertise available with CUJ/HEIs.
- HED will nominate a single-point contact for coordination with HEIs and CUJ for successful implementation of skilling initiatives.
- Both parties will mutually help each other and use their expertise for organizing the event or completing the R&D project successfully.
- Both parties shall hold/conduct joint workshops, conferences, training programs within the identified areas of co-operation for the benefit of the students.

1.1 ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1.1.1 HED:

- HED provide the list of colleges/ institutions for introduction of skill based training which shall form an integral part of this MOU.
- The colleges/ institutions shall provide the required infrastructure for the delivery of the courses in the colleges which includes existing classrooms and computer labs.
- HED shall ensure streamlining the introduction of Skill based programmes in all UG courses/ programmes of all the identified colleges with the scheme of studies of the respective courses/ programmes.
- HED and CUJ through TPs shall organize programmes jointly to create awareness of their partnership in various identified institutions/ colleges.
- HED shall allocate budget for training, assessment and certification of the students in the identified domains to the HEIs implementing a skill programs
- HEIs will promote and encourage enrolment of students in skill based programmes. This
 activity will include press release, sharing information on college websites, promoting
 the engagement on other social media platforms, as and when required.
- HED wherever required will issue necessary directions for integration of skill-based training into the daily teaching schedule / time table of the respective colleges.

1.1.2 CUJ:

- CUJ will identify Sectors and job roles for students as appropriate for the various streams of Arts, Commerce and Science.
- The QP-NOS based courses will be introduced for the students from semester 3rd to 5th.
- NSQF level 4 courses will be introduced as add on course or as part of the Degree under this MoU.
- CUJ shall identify Professional Trainers/TPs having experience and expertise to provide QP-NOS based training as per the stream and sector identified for training

- CUJ shall adhere to the partner-driven approach with colleges/ institutions of HED
 to achieve common goals and meet high expectations regarding student's skill
 empowerment.
- CUJ shall support in benchmarking quality of the training, assessments and certification according to the standards and processes of respective Sector Skill Councils (SSC).
- CUJ shall discharge all or any of the above activities either itself or through TPs/
 SSC
- The CUJ shall be responsible for placement of the trained students in industry or self employment of the trained students
- CUJ will ensure assessment and certification of the skill course through SSC or University certification with logo of HEI or otherwise.

1.1.3 JOINT ROLES AND RESPONSIBLITIES OF HED AND CUJ

- CUJ shall monitor the quality of the Skill based programme along with HED.
- Both parties shall establish procedures to facilitate regular contact at the executive and operational levels to discuss issues arising in relation to the project.
- Both parties constituted under this MoU shall hold meetings, between senior
 officials to discuss coordination of matters relevant to the operations of this MoU as
 and when required.

2. Duration of MoU:

This MoU is effective upon the day and date last signed and will be executed by the duly authorized representatives of the parties to this MoU and shall remain in full force and effective for three years from the signed date, following which it will be reviewed by both the parties for extension two years on the basis of outcomes and placements.

3. Amendments:

Either party may request changes to this MoU. Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this MoU which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this MoU shall be incorporated by written instrument, and effective when executed and signed by both parties to this MoU.

4. Governance and Coordination

An Advisory Committee will be set-up for effective governance and coordination of the courses under the scheme. The Advisory Committee will include the representative(s) of HED and Project Implementation Team of CUJ.

The following shall constitute the Advisory Committee for reviewing the progress of Collaborative Program(s) between CUJ and HED. The Committee will meet periodically to review the functioning of the courses, as and when required, but at least once in six months. The Advisory Committee shall consider the addition/deletion of areas of co-operation between the

5. Confidentiality:

The parties shall maintain absolute confidentiality with regard to the other party's proprietary information. Parties acknowledge that there are general laws applicable to the unauthorized

disclosure of confidential information. The parties agree that, during the term of this agreement any confidential or proprietary information related to project will be accessible by other parties after getting mutual permission.

5. Force Majeure:

Either party shall be excused from performance of this agreement during or to the extent that performance is prevented by the occurrence of unforeseen causes beyond the control of anticipated or unforeseeable by and without the negligence of the party claiming excuse. Such causes include, without limitation, strike, go slow, other concerted acts of workmen, acts of god, war, fire, explosion, action of elements, earthquake, flood, civil disturbance and government restrictions and limitations. The party claiming excuse shall give immediate written notice thereof to the other, in any case not later than 30 days, following the occurrence of such event. If performance is held up for a continuous period of more than 4 months from the date of first notice, then the two parties shall review the situation and agree upon a course of action so as to protect their interest.

7. Relationship between the Parties:

Parties shall perform its obligations under this MoU by using reasonable skill, knowledge, standard professional practices and reasonable care. Parties shall perform their obligations under this MoU as an independent Party and not as employee, agent, partner or joint venture. The Parties shall discharge their obligation by application of professional knowledge, skills and experience in good faith.

8. The Co-Branding and Publication Policy:

Any of the Parties logos shall be used for any of the material/publications/prints, ONLY upon approval from the concerned party. Neither party shall violate other party's' branding policy and shall not use the other party's logos on any other publication, advertisement, campaign or quotation in documents, other than the project, where relevant and approved, branding will be accomplished in accordance with the Parties' respective legal, policy and procedural requirements.

Near-final drafts and all proofs of campaign materials shall be shared between the Parties for technical evaluation and advice before final production. The Parties will collaborate in the development of outreach and education materials regarding the programs for external audiences.

9. Legally / Financially Binding:

Both the parties intend to mutually cooperate in the first place and in good faith to accomplish the objectives of this MoU as and where stated. The financial matter pertaining to training and consultancy will be dealt by the concerned colleges entering into a separate MoU for specific skill courses.

10. Termination:

The Parties enter into this MoU while wishing to maintain their own separate and unique missions and mandates, and their own accountabilities. The cooperation among the Parties as

outlined in this MoU shall not be construed as a partnership or other type of legal entity or personality. Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as superseding or interfering in any way with any agreements or contracts entered into among the Parties, either prior to or subsequent to the signing of this MoU. Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as an exclusive working relationship. The Parties specifically acknowledge that this MoU is not an obligation of funds, nor does it constitute a legally binding commitment by any Party or create any rights in any third party.

The Higher Education Department in its sole discretion, by giving a prior notice of one month to the other party, may terminate this agreement without assigning any reason thereof.

11. Signatures:

In witness whereof, the parties to this MoU through their duly authorized representatives have executed this MoU on the days and dates set out below, and certify that they have read, understood, and agree to the terms and conditions of this MoU as set forth herein.
