Department of Higher Education

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Introduction

The Higher Education is one of the most important sectors of the development among the social sectors. The Department of Higher Education is charged with the responsibility to monitor and regulate the dissemination of Higher Education above 10+2 level in the UT by extending facilities for opening of colleges and Universities. At present, there are two State Universities, three private universities and two Cluster Universities Srinagar/Jammu in the UT of J&K besides two Central Universities. There are 142 Government Degree Colleges. In addition to this one each Engineering College at Jammu and Kashmir and Five Private Engineering Colleges are functioning in the UT of J&K.

Enrolment

GER- 3.50 lakh students enrolled 2.5 lakh UG, 0.5 PG, 0.5 Distance Mode, GER in J&K is 30.9% above national average of 26.3% and girls are 52%

Quality Certificate

- 54 colleges have valid NAAC accreditation.
- 5 Universities (KU* A Grade with CGPA of 3.11, JU** A Grade with CGPA of 3.51, SMVDU, IUST B Grade with CGPA of 2.52, BGSBU C grade) have NAAC accreditation
- NIRF Ranking of KU 48, JU 52, (Top 100 Universities in the Country)

IT enabled Classrooms/Labs

- 1025 out of 2039 classroom/Labs shifted from traditional to digital mode
- Rest of the classrooms/Labs shall be covered in the current Financial Year

E-learning

- E-content through SWAYAM for 87-degree course subjects
- 400 NPTELS for engineering and professional courses.
- 18800 online lectures on Google classroom platform during COVID pandemic

Scholarship

- **PMSSS**: 4488 students provided 100 crores under the scheme. This year 22500 students registered.
- **Pragati**: To provide encouragement and support to Girl Child to pursue technical education
- Saksham: Aimed at providing encouragement and support to specially abled children to pursue Technical Education

Employability enhancement initiative

- GATE coaching, IT domain skilling, induction programs, employability skill training, cost accountancy training, and certificate courses being provided to students.
- 3978 students trained under 17 different IT Domain Skill courses in 86 colleges with the help of NIELIT and Central university of Jammu.
- JK Higher Education Department in collaboration with ICT Academy Chennai initiated skill development project called Jammu and Kashmir Employability Enhancement and Training Programme (JEET) for Technical institutes. There will be total 13 courses.

- Project on Employability Training (PET) is going to be launched in June, 2021 in collaboration with JK Higher Education Department and ICT Academy Channai. Central University of Jammu will act as Nodal agency for this Project.
